Session Formats & Presentation Modes: Research Symposium

Presentation Modes

All sessions will be presented virtually. Panels, roundtables, and workshops will be **live sessions**; posters will be presented as **on-demand sessions**.

Live Sessions:

- Scheduled once during the symposium on October 7 or October 8 and presented live via Zoom
- Presenters must be registered symposium participants and be present to interact with attendees in real time
- Sessions may include pre-recorded segments, in particular to help accommodate international presenters in different time zones
- All sessions will be recorded for on-demand viewing after the symposium through April 2022

On-Demand Sessions:

- Only posters will be offered as on-demand sessions. Posters are PDF files that may be accompanied by optional three-minute pre-recorded introductions.
- On-demand are available throughout the symposium for asynchronous viewing at any time without a scheduled presentation time.
- Presenters must be registered symposium participants but do not need to be in attendance. There is a general poster session on Thursday, October 7 from 5:00–6:15 PM EDT; all poster presenters are encouraged to be available at this time; more information will be provided in mid-September.
- Poster presenters who wish to include an optional introduction to their posters need to submit pre-recorded mp4 files by September 15 to allow time for processing (additional instructions will be provided).
- On-demand posters and recordings will continue to be available for viewing after the conference through April 2022.

Session Formats

Research Poster

Posters offer a venue for sharing and discussing **completed studies** on a range of topics, methodologies, approaches, and challenges in EE research. Posters are **PDF images** that summarize research studies through text, images, and data. They are most often created using applications such as Adobe InDesign, Adobe Illustrator, Microsoft Publisher, Microsoft PowerPoint, and others. Presenters may include an optional pre-recorded introduction up to three minutes in length. All posters and associated recordings will be offered as on-demand sessions.

Research Roundtable

Roundtable discussions center on **reviews, questions, and challenges** related to *method and theory* or *pedagogy and programming* in EE research (as described above). The full session lasts 45 minutes, including a **brief presentation with emphasis on spirited group discussion**. The program committee may combine roundtable proposals on similar topics into multi-presenter discussions, in which case presenters will need to adjust their speaking time. Each research roundtable will be held in its own virtual room with active attendee participation. All roundtable discussions will be scheduled as live sessions.

Panel Presentation

In panel presentations, several researchers focus on a **question or challenge** related to *method and theory* or *pedagogy and programming* in EE research (as described above) and explore it from a variety of perspectives. These 45-minute sessions include 10-minute presentations by multiple panelists and at least 15 minutes of discussion with attendees. All panel presentations will be scheduled as live sessions.

Research Workshop

Research workshops are **skill-building sessions** intended to help develop critical competencies related to *method and theory* or *pedagogy and programming* in EE research (as described above). These 60-minute sessions should have multiple presenters/facilitators and be as interactive as possible. All workshops will be scheduled as live sessions.
